




FEDERAL AND INDIAN LANDS



This map shows Federal administration and trusteeship of principal land units by agency to the extent scale permits. Units smaller than a township (36 square miles, or about 23,000 acres) generally are omitted. Some units are entirely or partially administered by more than one agency.

The scale of the map does not permit exclusion of areas of management lands smaller than a township within proclamation boundaries. Some agencies administer large units with proclaimed boundaries which contain relatively little Federal ownership. Such units have been omitted if they contain less than 23,000 Federally-owned acres. Private holdings may exist within the units that are not shown on this map.

Most of the land administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is not within proclamation boundaries. The land is often composed of discontinuous tracts, which may vary in density from 25 percent to all of a given region. This "checkered" pattern of BLM lands has been generalized because of the scale of the map.

Bureau of Indian Affairs lands are not public lands, but are held in trust for American Indian and Alaska Native tribes. These Indian lands are enclosed by boundaries established by treaties or proclamations. In most cases these boundaries enclose more acreage than is held in trust, for it is impractical to separate trust lands from other interperpet lands at this scale. Scale does not permit naming each of the Indian lands in southern California.

Narrow, essentially linear Federal land units such as parkways, trails, and rivers, are not shown due to scale limitations even though some exceed 23,000 acres. Wildernesses, and most other proclaimed entities that are administrative subdivisions of larger Federal units, are not shown.
