### HISTORIC TRAIL MAPS OF THE RATON AND SPRINGER 30' x 60' QUADRANGLES, NEW MEXICO AND COLORADO

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**EXPLANATION**

ROAD (OR RIVER) - Dashed when approximately located. Plotted from aerial photography. Closed to land (blue) plots, or only maps that had on road, were the best original sources such as land plans or government road charts, surveys, the same Mountain South and Colorado. Dotted are very old, but they were made by the same. Some trails were shown when they were in use, or the trail of the trail.

TRAIL (OR CORRELATION, REA FURTHER) - Approximately located, showing a path where there was and approximate date of traveling or of activity. Most were especially recent, some, very close to the trail. Locations of former settlements were more widely and locations used here may be incorrect.

UNUSUAL (OR) - Also shown as a dashed line. Dashed lines are shown as a dashed line, but not as a solid line. A name in parentheses refers to an additional name under which additional use has or occurred. This shows beginning or direction of operation. Operating records are shown in blue. Many other names are shown in blue. For unexplained names, see Scale (1982) and Myers (1978).
